June Graduation Concerts

On Sunday 11th June, thirty-four students graduated across two concerts held at Concordia College Chapel. Each of these students was invited by their teacher to make a video recording of a set level piece. This was submitted to the assessor for feedback.

Graduation assessment is always a positive experience, as teachers are careful to ensure that students have mastered the requirements of the level before suggesting graduation. In this way, students always succeed.

Having recorded the set-piece for the graduation level, students can then choose a favourite piece to perform solo on stage at the concert. Friends and family watch from the audience and clap enthusiastically as the child finishes playing and receives a graduation certificate and flower. The student leaves the concert feeling proud of their achievements and motivated to continue working on their beautiful tone ready for the next level.

President's Report Term 3 - August 2023

Welcome everyone to Term 3. I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday. Lessons have started so it is a good time to revisit the basics of the Suzuki Philosophy.

One important aspect of the Suzuki Method is the emphasis on listening. Children learn to speak through listening to their parents and families talking in their native tongues. In the same way, children can learn the Suzuki pieces, through immersion in a musical environment.

Generally children are not listening enough to the recordings. Music is more than the correct notes. It is important to play a recording every day, so students know how the pieces sound. It is stressful for a child to start a new piece not being familiar with the music.

Success begins with listening, followed by practising one step at a time. You can make a chart for daily listening with goals along the way. Students can work towards a concert which offers such a lot of benefits, including building self-esteem and motivation.

For a child to improve their learning, they need daily practice, patience and nurturing. Foster a sense of caring and always give positive feedback. Children want to please their parents and extended family, and need your constant support and enthusiasm to make progress.

These days our lives are very busy, and often the day is over before there has been time to practice. The conditions of the environment will shape your child's ability and growth. Be patient with slow progress as this will lead to a strong foundation that is so important for musical development and technical ability. Your children are so fortunate to have the support of family and teacher to guide their musical progress. In today's world, children are exposed to so much technology, and learning to play an instrument can bring a sense of calmness to the day.

They can develop the patience to focus on the task at hand and practise slowly with necessary repetitions. This is not something that comes naturally – it takes a lot of work, but the results are well worth the effort.

This term there is the Showcase Concert on the 17th of September. I would encourage you to bring your friends and family to this concert. It is a wonderful afternoon of entertainment and so uplifting to hear the children perform.

I hope you all have a wonderful term. The weeks go so quickly so make the most of the next seven weeks before the holidays commence again.
